How to find us:
From Takoradi, take the road to Axim/Elubo, and turn left directly at Toll Barrier 32. It then takes about 25 to 30 minutes to reach our beautiful beach. Everywhere along the way you will see signs to Kedas Lodge.

ANKASA RAINFOREST

The Ankasa Conservation Area lies in south-west Ghana on the border with the Ivory Coast. Covering 509 sq km, this protected area falls within an ancient rainforest and is the most bio-diverse in Ghana. It represents the only wet evergreen protected area in an almost unspoiled state. It is home to over 800 plant species, including some endemic ones such as the recently discovered Psychotria. Over 600 butterfly species, with many endemic species, have been recorded, and the network of streams in the area is an important breeding ground for many of the fish species in the region as well as being of an important source for the rivers west and south of the protected area with many yet-to-be discovered plants and animal species, Ankasa offers a virgin laboratory for scientists and students.

AXIM

Fort San Antonio is Axim's main tourist attraction, constructed by the Portuguese in 1515, it is the second-oldest fortress after Elmina Castle. After your tour of the fort, you are free to observe the magnificent views of the colonial-era buildings of the Axim township. From here, you can learn the history of the settlement and the people of Axim. It is said that Axim was a major port for the export of mainly timber products and gold.

CROCODILE INVOCATION

Directly in our neighbouring-Village- only 3 km away, the local fetish priest entices the crocodiles from the water with a chicken. Bring a bottle of schnapps for the libation. Visitors are welcome every day except Wednesday, a sacred day.

NZULEZU – HOUSES ON STILTS

This is an amazing village where life goes on in the centre of Lake Amansuri, just 90 km west of Takoradi. The houses are built on stilts, and traditional village life adapts to the watery conditions. The excursion to the stilt village starts from Miemia with the Jeep. To the stilt village itself locals go in their traditional canoe. For tourists, though, they use the more comfortable boats. On the journey you will enjoy the unique view of reeds, mangroves and marshland. Many sea birds nest in this peaceful area. Except Thursday – which is a holiday – you can attend the village daily.

CAPE COAST

The strategic location of Cape Coast, having a sheltered beach in proximity to Elmina Castle, made it highly attractive to European nations. Hence, for nearly a century, there was a ding-dong competition between the Portuguese, Dutch, Danes, Swedes and English to gain control of the area. The Portuguese built the first trade lodge in 1555 and called the local settlement "Cabo Corso", meaning short cape coast. The Swedes, led by Krusenstjerna, built a permanent fort in 1653 and called it Carolusburg after King Charles X of Sweden. During the next 11 years, the Danes, the local Fetu chief and the Dutch each in turn captured and held Carolusburg for a time. Finally, the English fleet took Carolusburg.

CANOPY WALKWAY

The Kakum Canopy Walkway, Africa's first and only rainforest walkway, is composed of 350 metres of suspended bridge and six tree platforms that reach the height of 30 metres above the forest floor. From the treetops, visitors experience a unique and spectacular view of the rainforest ecosystem and have the opportunity to see flora and fauna, which could never be viewed from the ground. Hundreds of species of butterflies and birds can be

viewed from the walkway early in the morning and if visitors are lucky, they may catch a glimpse of the Spotnose, Campbell's and Columbus monkeys.

PRINCESS TOWN

Princess Town, also known as 'Prince's Town', and by its local names 'Pokesu' or 'Bokaso', is best known as the site of the elegant Brandenburg-built fort Gross Friedrichsburg, constructed in 1683. The once-ruined fort Gross Friedrichsburg has been partially restored and serves now as a tourist attraction and picnic area. Kayaktours to Princess Town start in our resort.
